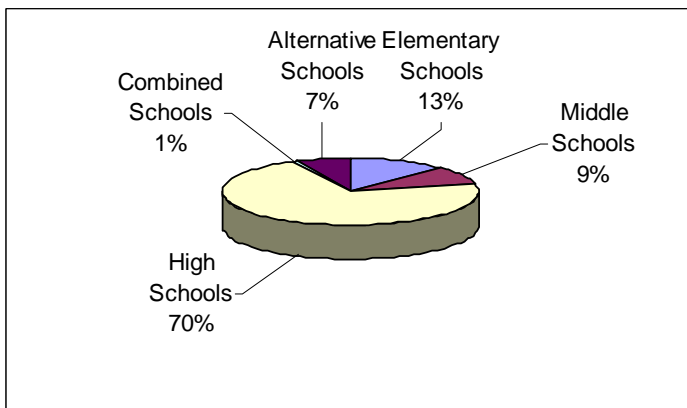
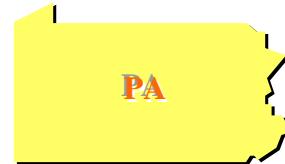


## AT A GLANCE: 2006-2007 COMMUNITIES IN SCHOOLS - Pennsylvania

### CIS Connects Students with Services

- ❖ 5 operational local affiliates
- ❖ 175 school sites
- ❖ 93,062 students are enrolled in schools in which CIS has a presence and have access to services
- ❖ 19,598 are directly connected with services through CIS



### CIS Provides More Opportunities for Young People

CIS affiliates in Pennsylvania provide students with the “Five Basics”:

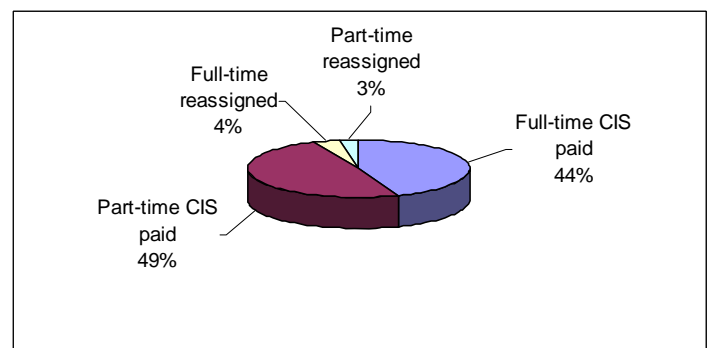
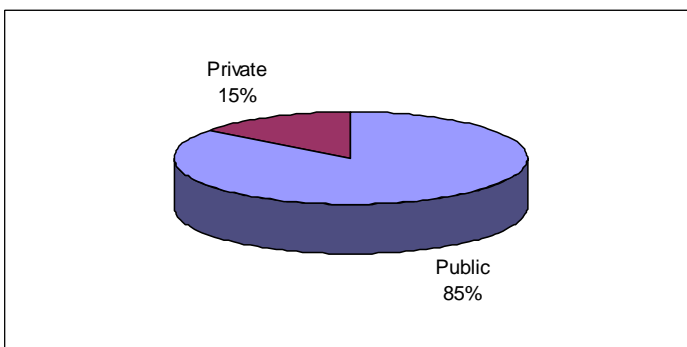
- ❖ 100 percent provide a one-on-one relationship with a caring adult
- ❖ 100 percent provide a safe place to learn and grow
- ❖ 80 percent provide a healthy start and a healthy future
- ❖ 100 percent provide a marketable skill to use upon graduation
- ❖ 100 percent provide a chance to give back to peers and community

### CIS Leverages Human Capital to Help Kids

In Pennsylvania, 1,956 individuals and 716 community partners contribute to the success of CIS; 1,393 volunteers and 110 board members contributed 23,958 hours of service. The following chart shows the proportion of individuals who contribute to the success of CIS.

CIS in Pennsylvania uses a combination of public and private resources – proof of the collaborative nature of the CIS process.



## CIS Gets Results

CIS identified a very specific group of students for needed assistance in one or more of seven areas – *attendance, behavior, suspensions, school achievement, promotion, graduation, and staying in school*. The results achieved by CIS affiliates are even more remarkable when the greater challenges faced by the CIS-tracked student population are considered. These are young people who, without the intervention of CIS, would likely fall far below the national average for student success. Following are the outcomes of CIS in Pennsylvania:

### Remained in School

- 92 percent of the 2,496 CIS students tracked as potential dropouts remained in school at the end of the 2006-2007 school year.

### Improved Attendance

- 80 percent of the 3,569 students tracked for attendance problems showed improvement in attendance.

### Improved Behavior

- 88 percent of the 2,765 students tracked for behavior problems showed improvement in behavior.

### Fewer Suspensions

- 76 percent of the 1,038 students tracked for suspensions had fewer suspensions.

### Improved Achievement

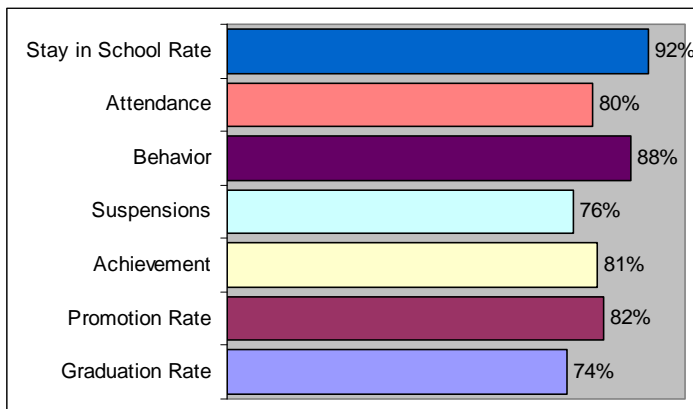
- 81 percent of the 5,911 students tracked for academic performance showed improvement in achievement.

### Promotion Rate

- 82 percent of the 9,953 students tracked for promotion risk were promoted to the next grade.

### Graduation Rate

- 74 percent of the 935 eligible seniors graduated.



## CIS in Pennsylvania is Part of a National Network

According to data collected from the 2006-2007 school year, CIS makes a national impact in the following ways:

- ✓ **More than 2 million** students had access to CIS services.
- ✓ **More than 1.2 million** students were connected to resources through CIS.
- ✓ **193** local CIS affiliates operated in **27** states and the District of Columbia.
- ✓ **More than 3,200** school sites were served by CIS.
- ✓ **More than 50,000** volunteers donated their time to CIS last year.
- ✓ **78 percent** of tracked students improved attendance.
- ✓ **89 percent** of tracked students had fewer behavior incidents.
- ✓ **78 percent** of tracked students had fewer suspensions.
- ✓ **80 percent** of tracked students improved academic performance.
- ✓ **82 percent** of tracked students were promoted to the next grade.
- ✓ **78 percent** of eligible seniors graduated.
- ✓ **97 percent** of CIS-tracked students were still in school at the end of the school year.
